Karimganj College, Karimganj is affiliated to Assam University Silchar and follows the modalities of conducting the continuous Internal Evaluation as per the university course requirement. Two internal tests are mandatory for the in each semester. The College fixes the dates and mode of internal evaluation. At the beginning of the semester it the dates are made known to the students through the academic calendar. Through a meeting of heads of all the departments and AoC(Assistant officer incharges to carry out the examination process), at first some tentative dates and modalities are finalized and finally it is confirmed in the meeting of the teachers council. Scrutiny of the prepared question paper is carried out by Head of the department to ensure quality of the Question paper. The faculty submits the re-corrected scripts to the examination department and marks are displayed on the notice board and then uploaded in the university examination portal. Result review meetings are conducted department wise with result analysis and the remedial actions for further improvements are arrived after discussion. Performance of the students in Internal Assessment is used to identify slow and advanced learners in their respective subjects and adopt appropriate measures accordingly as needed
