About Karimganj College, Karimganj

An educational home for all communities, an El Dorado opening its gate bidding all enter and possess

Established in 1946 by a galaxy of dedicated nationalist, philanthropists and academics with a pious vision to disseminate Higher Education in this remote part of the country, Karimganj College Completes 75 year in June 2021. We sincerely recollect with reverence the selfless, dedicated service rendered by the chief architects of this institution Late Md. Eahya Khan Choudhury, the then SDO, Karimganj, Late Rabindra Nath Aditya, a nationalist and one time chief whip of Congress Party in Assam Legislative Assembly and Late Pramesh Chandra Bhattacharyya, the scholar-administrator for laying down a strong foundation of noble vision as President, Secretary and Principal of the college respectively. Donations from generous donors in large and small denominations poured in, so that this institution could be gradually given a full-fledged form to cater to the needs of higher education irrespective of caste, creed, sex, religion and language. The founding fathers of the college were far ahead of their times in as much as they envisaged in 1946, an institution that would teach not only the conventional subjects but also technology and crafts.

The college introduced Science and Arts subjects like Bengali, English, Philosophy, Physics, Chemistry etc. back in 1940s. The venture received good wishes from Gopinath Bordoloi, the then Prime Minister of Assam (1946), Triguna Sen, Ex-education minister, Govt. of India (1951), Prof. Meghnad Saha (1954), S. Fazal Ali, his excellency Governor of Assam (1958) and many others. The college survived the trauma of partition and also onslaught of many baffling problems in the post-partition period but nothing could arrest its striding move towards imparting nourishment to generations of students many of whom now hold positions of pride in several places of India and abroad. The college was originally affiliated to the Calcutta University, then to the Gauhati University and in 1994, when the Assam University was established, it became affiliated to the later. Today, it is one of the leading colleges under Assam University imparting education in all three streams - Arts, Science and Commerce. At present, the college offers Honours courses in 20 subjects and Pass courses in 21 subjects. The Commerce streams of the college was introduced in 1950s and with the help of well-equipped teachers rapidly became an equally prestigious part of the institution. On the occasion of the Golden Jubilee celebration of the college in 1996, it was decided to impart Computer Education to enterprising students to help them build up challenging career. Accordingly, the Karimganj College Computer Centre started offering courses from the session 1999-2000. The college has introduced compulsory general Computer course for TDC students spreading over three academic session based on 'O' - level curriculum of DOEACC from the Session 2005-06. It is a great pleasure to mention that the college has been selected as one of the two IT-institutes of Assam under NEC programme and accordingly, the college is offering two degree programmes viz. B.Sc. (Computer Science) and BCA affiliated to Assam University from the academic Session 2005-06.

The College has also introduced B.Sc. Honours Programme in Biotechnology with effect from the session 2006-07. In the session 2010-11, the college has introduced Ecology and Environmental Science as one of its TDC Pass programme.

It is also a great pleasure to mention that Department of Science and Technology (DST-FIST) Govt. of India has provided financial assistance in the session 2009-10 for upgrading the infrastructural facilities for Science Education in the college. The Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Govt. of India also selected the college in the session 2010-11 under STAR COLLEGE Scheme for improvement of teaching learning process of its Science departments. A Biotechnology Hub has been established in the college during the session 2010-11 under the sponsorship of Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India to make available modern research facilities in Life Sciences and Biotechnology. In 2015, the hub has been upgraded to advanced status by DBT. In the recent years the college has attracted many major and minor research projects like UGC- MRP, DST - first track, DBT twinning, DBT - RGYI etc. Indeed these investments through development of human resource, infrastructure and relevant investigations will foster new vistas for growth of the college and society.

To transform the College to a Centre of Excellence by imparting quality and value based education for all round development of the students.

The college welcomes the new generation of students who enter this institution with hearts vibrating with hopes and aspirations. Let every student of this institution develop intellectual and moral power in a healthy environment and strengthen himself / herself physically, mentally and spiritually, so that everyone turns out at the end of education career, a useful citizen with greater social involvement. Let us recollect the words of Annie Besant, "the destiny of a Nation is folded within its budding youths as is the flower within the close embrace of petals".

Code of Conduct for Students

This Handbook indicates the standard procedures and practices of Karimganj College, Karimganj (hereinafter referred to as the 'Institute') for all students enrolling with the Institute for pursuing different courses. All students must know that it is incumbent upon them to abide by this Code of Ethics and Conduct (hereinafter referred to as the 'Code') and the rights, responsibilities including the restrictions flowing from it. That the Institute's endeavour by means of enforcing this Code is to pioneer and administer a student discipline process that is egalitarian, conscientious, effectual and expeditious; and providing a system which promotes student growth through individual and collective responsibility.

All Students are expected to be well conversant with this Code, which can be also reviewed on the official website of the Institute.

Conduct

The code depicted underneath shall apply to all sorts of conduct of students within the college premises and their off-campus mannerism which may have serious consequences or adverse impact on the Institute's interests or reputation.

At the time of admission, each student would have to sign a statement consenting to abide by the framed codes and should also affirm undertakings that –

- ✓ The student shall be regular in the classes and must complete his/her studies in the Institute.
- ✓ In case, the student is forced to discontinue studies for any legitimate reason, he/she may be relieved from the Institution subject to the written consent of the College Authority.
- ✓ If the student is relieved from the college, he/she shall have to clear all pending dues and if the student had joined the Institute on a scholarship, the said grant shall be revoked. The College believes in promoting a safe and efficient climate by enforcing behavioural standards. All students must uphold academic integrity. They should be respectful to all persons, to their rights and duties, to the college property and to the safety of others.

The various forms of Misconduct, the Students are expected to refrain from, include:

Any act of discrimination (physical or verbal) based on an individual's gender identity, caste, race, religion or religious beliefs, colour, region, language, disability, marital or family status, physical or mental disability etc.

- ☞ Intentionally damaging or destroying Institute's property or property of other students and/or Faculty members & Support staffs.
- ☞ Any disruptive activity in a class room or in an event sponsored by the College.
- ☞ Inability to produce the identity card, issued by the Institution, or refusing to produce it on demand by campus security personnel.
- ☞ Participating in activities including:
 - ✓ Organizing meetings and processions without permission from the Institution.
 - ✓ Membership of any groups banned by the Institution or by the State or Central Government.

- ✓ Unauthorized possession, carrying or use of any weapon, ammunition, explosives or potential weapons, fireworks contrary to law or policy.
- ✓ Unauthorized possession or use of harmful chemicals and banned drugs. Smoking within the College campus.
- ✓ Possessing, consuming, distributing, selling of alcohol in the Institute and/or throwing empty bottles on the campus of the Institute.
- ✓ Parking a vehicle (Four wheeler / Two wheeler / Bicycle etc.) in a no parking zone or in the area earmarked for other than the students.
- ✓ Not disclosing a pre-existing health condition, either physical or psychological which may cause hindrance to the academic progress of the student.
- ✓ Pilfering or unauthorized access to the resources of others.
- ✓ Students are expected not to interact, on behalf of the Institution, with media representatives or invite media persons on to the campus without the permission of the authorities of the institute.
- ✓ Students are not permitted to do recording of either audio or video of the lectures delivered in class rooms, actions of other students, faculty or staff without prior permission.
- ✓ Students are not permitted to provide audio and video clippings of any activity in the campus to print and/or electronic media without prior permission.
- ✓ Students are expected to be careful and responsible and exercise restraints while using the Social Media. They should desist from posting derogatory comments about other individuals of the Institute and refrain from indulging in such other related activities having grave ramifications on the reputation of the Institute.
- ✓ Causing damage to or destruction of any property of the College or any property of others at the premises would invite punishment.

A committee will be there to look after any possible breach of the aforesaid codes of conduct by a student. It will inquire into the alleged violation and accordingly recommend suitable disciplinary action against the said student. The committee may give a hearing to the student to ascertain the misconduct and suggest one or more disciplinary actions based on the nature of misconduct.

THE CAMPUS

Situated at the bank of river Kushiyara the Karimganj College campus is extremely safe and congenial for students. It is located in an area surrounded by local communities who are closely related with the institution. It is surrounded by boundary walls having playground, large pond, Girl's and Boy's hostel and high raised gates with security guards at all entrances and exits. While entering the college premises it is mandatory for the students to wear college uniform and to carry valid identity cards issued by the college. Visitors are required to register their names and purpose of visit at the college gates to avoid entry of any unscrupulous individual to the campus. The College Administration has installed closed circuit cameras to keep a constant vigilance on the campus and to ensure security of the students. The infrastructural set up of the college is spread across different Buildings/Blocks. The infrastructural set up of the college is spread across different rooms/ sections as given below:

Administrative Block

The Administrative section includes the Principal's Chamber, Office, auditorium, Conference Hall, Teacher's Common Room, Boy's Common Room, Girls' Common Room and some of the Academic Departments.

Library Block

This section contains the Central Library, class rooms, IGNOU Study Centre, and KKHSOU study centre.

Commerce Block

This section contains the Commerce department, Computer Laboratory and smart class, one Gallery, class rooms and UGC Network Resource Centre having internet, printing and photocopy facility.

Science Block

The renovated and extended science building contains Chemistry department along with sophisticated chemistry laboratories, ICT enabled class rooms, Physics department with sophisticated dark room, electronics laboratory, Computer Laboratory, ICT enabled smart class rooms, Mathematics Department with departmental class and Computer Laboratory, Geology Department, Ecology and Environment Science department, smart classes, DST, UGC, DBT & FIST funded Research Project laboratory, and IQAC Room.

Biotech Block

This building contains the Botany and Biotechnology department having microbiology laboratory, Tissue culture lab, Mushroom cultivation unit; DBT sponsored Biotech Hub, Zoology Department along with Museum of species, Statistics Department along with Classrooms and Computer Laboratory. Also, this building contains Department of Computer Science and Application and Karimganj College Computer Centre along with one DBT funded Digital Electronics & Scientific Computation Laboratory having microprocessor kit and 6 computers, one CLP Lab having 25 computers, one programming with IOT lab with IOT kits & 20 computers, NEC sponsored P. K. Deb Computer Laboratory with 31 Computers and a seminar hall/ class room and has the Department of Ecology and Environmental Science.

New (RUSA) Arts Block

This building contains different Arts departments namely Bengali, English, Arabic, Economics, History, Sanskrit, Political Science along with class rooms and one common smart class room with 10 computers.

Karimganj College has a group of experienced and efficient group of faculty members in different fields of study. Apart from their academic contribution to their respective subjects, they motivate students to participate in cultural, literary and sports activities and other non-scholastic activities for all round development of their personalities. Faculties of Karimganj College also serve as mentors of the students and counsel them to take care of their intellectual and emotional well-being.

The college has a transparent system of internal assessment and evaluation. It has an Examination cell to deal with the grievances of the students in a time bound and efficient manner in relating to examination.

From the Desk of Principal...

The founder Principal of the college late Pramesh Chandra Bhattacharjee was disciple of Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. This college has produced many scholars who have attained distinction in national and international arena. These honorable alumni have added glory to the college. Karimganj College is a three stream college and all the three streams impart education in honors and pass courses. In addition to HS & TDC CBCS, the College also offers FYUG Programmes of NEP 2020 from the session 2023-2024. Faculties of the college are actively associated in research work. Many faculties have to their credit large number of Minor and Major Research Project. College gives students the opportunity to excel in extracurricular and co-curricular activities by enrolling themselves in NCC, NSS, etc. Students are given immense scope to shine in sports, cultural activities by organizing annual sports and social week. Students can also participate in cricket, football and volleyball competition organized by the District Sports Association, Karimganj and Assam University, Silchar. In indoor games also students get the opportunity to prove their talents and proficiency. In order to instill the spirit of parliamentary democracy every year students elect their representatives and form the Students Union. The members of Students Union highlight and place the demands of the students before the Principal for finding solution to those problems. This is how they acquaint themselves with the Parliamentary Democracy system that is in existence in the country. Act of indiscipline by the students are dealt in strictly and severely by the Discipline Committee constituted by the Governing Body of the College.



This college a place of advanced scholarship has to its glory much success stories. Last NAAC certification exhibits volume of balanced intellectual voyage of the college. I welcome the students who are desirous of getting themselves admitted in this premiere institution. You have enormous opportunity to prove your curricular and co-curricular talent in the days to come. The college will extend all possible co-operations in helping out the student in their quest for attaining outstanding carrier.

Academic Integrity

Academic integrity is essential for the success of an Institution and its research missions as well, and hence its violation constitutes a serious offence. The Policy on academic integrity forms an integral part of the Code which applies to all students of the Institution to which they should adhere. Failure to uphold these principles shall threaten both the reputation of the Institution and the value of the degrees awarded to its students. Every student of the Institution should feel responsible to ensure the highest standards of academic integrity.

The principles of academic integrity require that a student should –

- ✓ Properly acknowledge and cite use of the ideas, results, material or words of others.
- ✓ Properly acknowledge all contributors to a given piece of work.
- ✓ Make sure that all assignments in a course done and submitted are his/her own.
- ✓ Perform academic activities without the aid of impermissible materials or results by ethical means and report them accurately without suppressing any results inconsistent with his/her interpretation or conclusions. Have right to pursue their educational goals without interference.
- ✓ Refrain from cheating. Cheating includes :
 - Copying during examinations, and copying of homework assignments, project report etc.
 - Allowing or facilitating copying, or writing a report or taking examination for someone else.
 - Fabricating (making up) or falsifying (manipulating) data and reporting them in publication.
 - Creating sources, or citations that do not exist.
 - Altering previously evaluated and re-submitting the work for re-evaluation.
 - Signing another student's name on an assignment, report, research paper or attendance sheet.

Anti-Ragging

The Institution has a coherent and an effective anti-ragging policy in place which is based on the 'UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009' (hereinafter referred to as the 'UGC Regulations'). The UGC Regulations have been framed in view of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India to prevent and prohibit ragging in all Indian Educational Institutions and Colleges. The said UGC Regulations shall apply mutatis mutandis to the Institution. Ragging constitutes one or more of the following acts:

- ☞ Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any student.
- ☞ Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any other student;
- ☞ Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such a student.
- ☞ Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any student.
- ☞ Exploiting the services of a student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- ☞ Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a student by other students.
- ☞ Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, and gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of a student.

- ☞ Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to any other student.
- ☞ Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any other student.

Anti-Ragging Committee

The Institute's Anti-Ragging Committee shall examine all complaints of anti-ragging and come out with recommendation based on the nature of the incident.

Anti-Ragging Squad

To render assistance to students, an Anti-Ragging Squad, which is a smaller body, has also been constituted consisting of various members of the campus community. The said Squad shall keep a vigil on ragging incidents taking place in the community and undertake patrolling functions. Students may note that the Squad is active and alert at all times and are empowered to inspect places of potential ragging, and also make surprise raids in hostels and other hotspots in the College. The Squad can also investigate incidents of ragging and make recommendations to the Anti-Ragging Committee and shall work under the guidance of the Anti-Ragging Committee.

A student found guilty by the committee will be imposed one or more of the following punishments, as recommended by the Anti-Ragging Committee:

- ☞ Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- ☞ Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process. Withholding results.
- ☞ Suspension/ expulsion from the hostels and mess. Cancellation of admission.
- ☞ Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. In cases where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institute shall resort to collective punishment.
- ☞ If need be, in view of the intensity of the act of ragging committed, a First Information Report (FIR) shall be filed by the Institute with the local police authorities.

The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institute shall take appropriate decision, including imposition of punishment, depending on the facts and circumstances of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging.

Gender Discrimination and Allied Harassment

For prevention and prohibition of sexual harassment at workplace, the Institution has a functional committee for Anti Sexual Harassment. Students should note that sexual misconduct or harassment encompasses a range of conduct, including but not limited to sexual assault, unwanted touching or persistent unwelcome comments, e-mails, or pictures of an insulting or degrading sexual nature, which may constitute harassment, which shall depend on the circumstances of each case. Any such instances will be investigated and punishment will be given by the committee. The committee will decide (as it deems fit) the nature of punishment against the nature of the incident occurred.

- Students passed in compartmental / supplementary examination in HSLC or equivalent examination will not be considered for admission in the college.
- The Admission Committee will select students for admission on the basis of merit. However the admission committee with the approval of the Principal may refuse admission to any applicant without assigning any reason.
- Reservation of seats under SC, ST, OBC (non-creamy layer) and PWD category will be applicable as per the rule of Govt. of Assam.
- Eligibility criteria in respect of marks will be relaxed by 5% for SC and ST candidates.
- If any seat remains vacant from the reserved category then that seat will be filled up from the applicants of general category.

- ☞ *Candidates seeking admission under the above-mentioned reserved category must submit a Caste Certificate/DA certificate with a photograph duly signed by the competent authority (D.C. or his nominee at the time of admission).*
- ☞ *Candidates seeking admission under sports, cultural and NCC quota must submit proof of participation in the State/National/International level competitions.*
- ☞ *Candidates seeking admission under TGL and employee quota must also submit relevant certificates duly signed by the competent authority.*
- ☞ *Students having a gap year must specify it at the time of online form submission. Their selection will be made on the basis of merit and submission of an affidavit at the time of admission. However, students who have passed the qualifying examination 4 years back will not be admitted.*
- ☞ *Self-attested photocopies of certificates, mark sheets and other related documents along with all originals must be produced at the time of admission.*

Eligibility

Higher Secondary (HS): A candidate must pass HSLC examination from the Board of Secondary Education, Assam, or equivalent examination recognized by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

Four-Year-Under-Graduate (FYUG) Courses: A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.

No candidate shall be allowed to offer **Botany/ Chemistry/ Mathematics/ Physics/ Zoology** as one of the DSC and DSM subjects unless s/he has passed the concerned subject in the qualifying examination. Further, no candidate shall be allowed to offer **Statistics** as one of the DSC and DSM subject unless s/he has passed Mathematics subject in the qualifying examination. There is no such restriction for opting AEC, IDC, SEC and VAC subjects.

Admission Portal for the Academic Session 2024-25

Four-Year-Under-Graduate Programme (FYUG):

It is to notify that the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam has opened Samarth e-Gov admission portal for the academic session 2024-25. Students seeking admission in 1st Semester of **Four Years undergraduate courses (FYUG)** are hereby notified to register and upload their profile in the **Samarth admission portal**. Students have to opt for institutions and programmes and complete the process of registration after declaration of the HS/Class XII results.

For registering, students are advised to visit the Samarth admission portal <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in>.

Higher Secondary (HS):

Students seeking admission into HS 1st year classes (Arts/Science/Commerce) are advised to visit the AHSEC admission portal, <https://darpan.ahseconline.in> for registration.

Again, as per the Secretary, Higher Education, Govt. of Assam letter No. Ref. No. 294817/132 dt. 03-04-2024, students who are willing to take admission under Fee Waiver Scheme of Govt. of Assam are asked to get their Income Certificate only from Circle Officer (competent revenue official) no other Income Certificate will be accepted for availing the Fee Waiver Scheme by the students.

Online Submission of Application Form

- ☞ Complete application form in all respects, must be submitted online on or before the last date of submission.
- ☞ *Necessary documents must be uploaded online while submitting the form. **The College will not entertain any incomplete application or application submitted after the last date of submission.***
- ☞ Applications without relevant documents will be rejected.
- ☞ Students are asked to apply for FYUG DSC for all the subjects. This is necessary in case a student fails to find admission in one subject as DSC he can opt another subject.

Four-Year-Under-Graduate Programme (FYUG):

Preamble: The FYUG program of study envisages making undergraduate education student-centric rather than system-centric or teacher-centric. Thus, in addition to dedicated focus to a discipline through core papers in Honours/Honours and Research, students can choose their courses from the 4 baskets which will offer greater freedom to choose allied/applied/broad areas of their discipline and the areas of other disciplines of their interest. In this system, the students can also opt for an interdisciplinary approach to learning. Further, keeping with the vision envisaged in NEP-2020, special emphasis has been laid on ability enhancement and skill development of students through choice of elective courses under these domains of study.

The **FYUG Programme** provides an opportunity for the students to choose from the prescribed curricula comprising **DSC (Discipline Specific Core) and DSM (Discipline Specific Minor), IDC (Inter Discipline Course), AEC (Ability Enhancement Course), VAC (Value Added Course) and SEC (Skill Enhancement Course)**. Students' progress throughout the study of prescribed curricula shall be evaluated by Continuous Assessment as it is anticipated to provide a more accurate and complete picture of the

learners' level and their understanding. Continuous Assessment & Grading System (CAGS) assesses the students' overall capabilities in the form of regular assignments, regularity in attendance and performance in semester end examinations.

All regular **Four-Year Under Graduate** programmes of study leading to **One Year Certificate Course, Two Years Diploma Course, Three Years Bachelor's Degree, Four Years Bachelor's Degree with Honours/ Honours and Research.**

Bachelor's Degrees under NEP 2020:

- ☞ B.A.(Honours/Honours and Research)
- ☞ B.Sc.(Honours/Honours and Research)
- ☞ B.Com.(Honours/Honours and Research)
- ☞ B.C.A.(Honours/Honours and Research)
- ☞ B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.C.A. Certificate and Diploma will be awarded based on his/her DSC paper.

Academic Bank of Credit (ABC):

In the present regulation under NEP 2020, there shall be provision for Credit Transfer options in order to facilitate mobility of students from one institution to another academic institution, weightage to prior learning, opportunity to learn-and-work, fragmented progress, and exploitation of institutional expertise. Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) shall be maintained at the National Academic Repository (NAD) under DigiLocker, where all credits earned by students shall be kept as a centralized database. Every student has to create an ABC ID to keep track of his/her acquired credits during the 7 years of FYUG Programme. Exit from FYUG Programme and lateral entry into the system, Inter- institutional mobility etc. will be guided by the already earned credits as per ABC.

Medium of Instructions:

The medium of instructions shall be English except programmes/ courses/ subjects/ topics in Modern Indian Languages.

Programmes of Study:

Programmes of Study means an educational programme under a set of required number of semesters leading to award of a Degree, Diploma and certificate.

Duration of Programme:

Duration of Programme means the period of time required for the completion of the programme.

Semester:

Semester is the period of academic activities into which an academic year is divided. There shall be minimum of **90 days teaching in each semester**. Depending upon duration, each academic year is divided into two semesters – Odd and Even Semesters. Total teaching days in each semester is divided into 3 (three) components—(i) classroom lectures, (ii) tutorials consisting of elaborate instructions on specific topics from classroom lectures and (iii) laboratory or field activities in which the student shall be doing experiments other practical works.

Credit Point (CP): Credit Point is the product of Grade Point and number of Credit for a course, thus,

$$CP = GP \times CR.$$

Grade Point (GP): Grade Point is a numerical weight allotted to each Grade Letter on a 10-pointscale.

Grace Marks: 1% of end semester total mark shall be awarded as grace marks provided s/he has to pass semester(s) after award of grace marks.

Lateral Entry: Admission to 2nd year (3rd semester) and 3rd year (5th Semester) and 4th year (7th Sem) for students from other Universities.

Re-Entry: Admission to FYUG programme after a break is permissible but s/he has to complete the remaining course within 7 years from the date of admission to the 1st semester.

Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): CCA is a parameter to assess learners' performance continuously and comprehensively internally by the colleges throughout the semester. It is also known as *Internal Assessment*.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): The SGPA is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all the semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters.

COURSES: Course in simple terms corresponds to one Paper under a particular 'Subject'. Courses in a programme of study may be of 08 (Eight) types viz.,

- i) Discipline Specific Core (DSC),
- ii) Discipline Specific Minor (DSM)
- iii) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC)
- iv) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)
- v) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
- vi) Value Added Course (VAC)
- vii) Dissertation/ Project
- viii) Internship

Discipline Specific Core (DSC):

This is the course which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core subject to complete a programme in a specific discipline of study.

Discipline Specific Minor (DSM):

The courses offered under the main discipline of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Minor Courses. From Discipline Specific Minor, students shall take two subjects related to his/her discipline. All DSM course shall be stand alone and students can select first minor subject and second minor subject according to their choice.

Interdisciplinary Courses (IDC):

Three interdisciplinary courses i.e. IDC-101, IDC-151 and IDC-201 with 3(three) credits each shall be studied in the entire FYUG programme in First Semester, Second Semester and Third Semester respectively. There are 04 baskets viz : Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I, II and III semester. For students of Colleges having multiple streams, choice of IDC shall preferably be from a discipline other than his/her own discipline.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

Ability Enhancement Courses are the compulsory courses and are based upon content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

The SEC Courses opted in 1st Semester shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester- wise change of SEC is not allowed. However, in case of change of DSC and DSM subjects in 3rd semester, change of SEC may be considered subject to fulfillment of other conditions. The SECs are the compulsory value based and/or skill-based aimed at providing hands-on- training, skills, etc. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

Value Added Course (VAC):

This is also common to all FYUG students of 1st and 2nd Semester. This course comprises of NSS, NCC, DTS, Sports, HW, Yoga, GCS and UI. NSS, NCC. Sports and Yoga courses comprise of both theory and practical components and remaining subjects are without practical component.

Dissertation/ Project Work:

Dissertation/ Project Work is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing /exploring a real-life situation/ difficult problem. A Dissertation/ Project Work is an optional paper and in lieu of Project /Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have option to take three additional courses as Discipline Specific Courses which will be equal to 12 credits in total.

Internship / Community Engagement/ Field Work:

This is a new and significant component of FYUG programme under NEP 2020. The course is a compulsory 2 credit course for 5th Semester students of all Disciplines under FYUGP as per UGC guideline. In this component there are three alternatives viz., Internship, Community Engagement and Field Work.

Programme of Study under NEP 2020:

The programme of study is to be called as “Four-Year Under Graduate Programme under NEP 2020” and in short ‘FYUG’ shall be a 8-semester programme of 4 (four) years’ duration and, there shall be 4 types of Certifications based on Exit from the FYUG system namely *Certificate, Diploma, Three Years Bachelor’s Degree and Four Years Bachelor’s Degree with Honours/ Honours and Research*

Multiple Lateral Entry and Exit:

There shall be provision of multiple lateral entry as well as multiple exit with a Certificate/Diploma/3 Years Bachelor's Degree/ 4 Years Bachelor's Degree (Honours/ Honours and Research) under FYUG programme after earning the required credits with the fulfillment of all criteria for award. Those students who have exited from FYUG with a Certificate/Diploma/ Bachelor's degree may return back into the FYUG programme for admission to the immediate next higher semester within a total of 7 years from the date of admission to the First Semester provided he/she has to complete the course within the stipulated times otherwise lateral entry shall NOT be permitted.

Condition on Changing of Core Course

Students securing CGPA 6.0 and above, with no back paper shall be allowed to change his/her core course once only, after completion of second semester. However, if a candidate desires to make one of his/her minors to core then automatic change in the minor should be done as same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.

While changing core in III semester, students shall not be allowed to opt already opted IDC subject as his/her changed core subject.

Registration to Assam University:

A candidate shall register himself/ herself with Assam University during his/ her admission to First Semester or lateral entry in the middle of the FYUG programme if s/he has migrated from another Institution. For registration, a student shall apply through the prescribed form by paying requisite registration fee. Previously registered students of other Board/ Council/ Higher Educational Institution/University shall have to submit original copy of migration certificate from the last institution while applying for registration under Assam University, Silchar. For students who have passed the last examination from Assam Higher Secondary Educational Council (ASEC), Guwahati, Assam submission of migration certificate is not required.

DEPARTMENTAL PROFILE:

1. Department of Physics:

Established in the year 1947, the Department has been catering to the demands of the science students for the last eight decades offering Physics subject at HS level and three-year CBCS & four-year FYUG courses at undergraduate level. Department has dedicated laboratories for each of these courses along with separate laboratories for Computational Physics, Electronics, Optics, Electricity Magnetism and General Physics. Along with this, the Department has been running two centers – Centre for Theoretical Physics and Center for Condensed Matter Physics since 2016. The centres run short term skill development certificate courses for students. The faculty members of the Department are actively engaged in research both in Theoretical and Experimental Physics.

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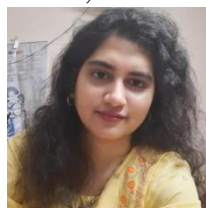

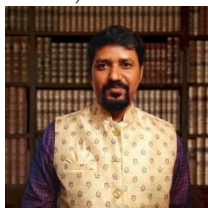

Students' Travelling Concession:

Travelling concession is available (by rail) when a group of students join an excursion team under the leadership of a teacher. Individual student can avail of travelling concession by rail for going home and coming back to the Institution during vacation. Air concession is also allowed only for travel from the Institution to Home Town as per rule of the IAC.

PROFESSIONAL (JOB-ORIENTED) PROGRAMMES

NIELIT (DOEACC) 'O' Level (IT):

NIELIT (DOEACC) is the brainchild of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and functions under the Department of Information Technology, Ministry of Communication and Information Technology, Govt. of India. The syllabus and examinations for the courses are developed by an expert panel drawn from academic, industry and the government. The NIELIT (DOEACC) „O“ level course is a foundation (Junior programmer) level course, which provides the students insight into the operational and programming aspects of Computers. This course structure has been designed for the students who are beginners in Computer world. They can be groomed as Assistant Programmer and get a break in the Computer industry. It comprises of four papers and a project. The course leads to NIELIT (DOEACC) “O” level certification. Course duration is one year and requires 480 contact hours. At Karimganj College Computer Centre, this course is taught and it requires attending theory / practical classes for two to three hours a day. The eligibility criteria for getting admission in to NIELIT (DOEACC) “O” Level Course is **10+2 pass Certificate or ITI Certificate (one year) after class 10.**

SOME SPECIAL FEATURES IN TEACHING-LEARNING METHODOLOGY

Remedial / bridge courses: In teaching-learning process, one important feature of the college is introduction of remedial / bridge courses to bridge the knowledge gap of incoming FYUG students. These courses are designed by the experienced teachers to enable the students particularly from rural areas, weaker section of the society and other states to cope with the new programme. The college also provided remedial coaching for SC / ST / OBC (non-creamy layer), minority and economically deprived students from the grant received from UGC during XIIth plan period.

Tutorial Classes: The College offers tutorial classes for the Honours students and H.S. (Science) students. These classes begin after autumn recess. Some science departments arrange tutorial classes for all FYUG students of the respective departments.

Mentor System: There is a provision for mentoring of Honours students. For proper functioning of this system, the students are divided into groups and each group is attached under a teacher mentor who looks after them and provides guidance for their academic attainments.

Student Group Insurance Scheme: The College provides compulsory Group Insurance (LICI) facility for Degree Students.

DISCIPLINE

1. College gives a great emphasis on discipline and character building of students and they are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline. The students are subjected to be under rules and regulations of the College prescribed by the College Authority from time to time. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory academic progress, irregular attendance to class, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, recourse to unfair means in examination etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable to disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
2. **Dress Code: To enforce discipline among the students, the College authority has introduced College Uniform for the Students from the academic Session 2003-2004. The students are to wear Uniform compulsorily as per following specification.**

For Day Section:

- a. For Boys:- Sky Blue *Shirt*, Black *Trousers*, Black-*neck tie* (optional). b) For Girls :- Sky Blue *Salwaar-Kameezes* with Black *Dopatta*.
 - b. Winter Garments: Navy Blue *Blazer / Pullover / Cardigan*.
 - c. A separate dress code for Degree 1st Semester Morning Section Students has been displayed on the notice board of the college and photograph of the same has also been given in the back cover page of the prospectus. Students without proper College Uniform will be debarred from attending Classes/College. e) Female students, if they wear head scurf, it should be uniform, that is, black in colour.
 - d. Female students should wear traditional salwar / pyjama.
 - e. Female students are to wear separate dopatta and head scurf (both black in colour)
3. Students are to keep Photo-Identity Cards with them in the college campus. On demand, the students are required to produce Photo-Identity Cards issued to them by the College authority. Failure to produce the Identity Card may debar them from attending classes/college.
 4. **Use of Cell-Phone in class room as well as in the corridors of the College is strictly prohibited. The Cell-Phone of Students, found involved in such practices may be seized and the students may be called for disciplinary action.**
 5. Students Union shall be subjected to such guidance and control as the College administration prescribes from time to time.
 6. No students' organization shall be allowed to use college premises for their organizational activities. Any notice of the Union desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the college and hostel premises shall require prior approval of the Principal.
 7. All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal and his decision will be final in all such cases.
